Our **spiritual**

Our **cultural**

development is finding out about and celebrating how other people live their lives, both now and in the past. Tolerance, respect and understanding of different faiths and cultures helps us to treat everyone equally. This prepares us for life in modern Britain.

when a group of people have equal rights and the freedom to choose how they are treated, rather than when one person has all the power and makes all the decisions. We have a 'voice' at school, which means that we can help make decisions for positive change.



Rule of Law
